District 202 ready for new school year

District 202 is ready for the 2005-2006 school year.

The first half-day of school is August 24 for students in grades 1 through 12. The first full-day of school is August 25 for students in preschool through grade 12.

Student Enrollment Growth

District 202 anticipates adding more than 2,400 new students this year bringing the total enrollment to 23,822 students.

The District projects having 12,082 elementary school students, 5,552 middle school students, and 6,188 high school students.

Schools Accommodate Growth

District 202 will open three new schools this year including Plainfield North High School, Charles Reed Elementary School, and Liberty Elementary School. This brings the total to 24 schools including one preschool, fourteen elementary schools, five middle schools, three traditional high schools, and one alternative high school.

the support of local voters in the March 2002 referendum as well as State School Construction grants. Two more schools remain on the March 2002 referendum that will open in 2006-2007.

Staff Accommodates Growth

To keep pace with the rapid student enrollment growth the District will grow by 197 certified, 119 support, and 13 administrator positions.

The addition of these positions will keep student to teacher ratios at approximately the same level they have been. The student to administrator ratio will be slightly higher than it has been.

Student Registration Information

Registration for returning and new students is a very important part of our planning process. To be sure we have hired enough staff, purchased enough books and materials, and are prepared for the start of the school year, we need students to register as early as possible.

Returning Students

Returning students should have completed and returned registration materials that were provided by their school. If you have not yet returned these materials, please do so immediately. If you need duplicate materials, please contact your school directly.

New Students

New students should register for school as soon as possible. Please do not wait until just before school starts to let us know you will be attending. We need time to prepare for your student's arrival.

All new students should register at the District Office (15732 Howard Street, Plainfield) Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. After registering at the District Office, high school students will be advised to schedule an appointment with a guidance counselor to select courses and pay fees.

New Student Registration Checklist

Be prepared with the following when you come to register:

- Illinois State Board of Education Transfer paper, if you are currently enrolled in another Illinois school district.
- Official Birth Certificate (not commemorative certificate from hospital).
- Record of Immunizations.
- Health Record Requirement.
- Cash, Checkbook, or Credit Card to pay fees.
- Proof of Residency, which includes 1 or 2 documents from Category A and 1 or 2 documents from Category B **for a total of three documents:**

Category A

1 or 2 of the following:

- Most recent real estate tax bill.
- Lease agreement for currently occupied residence.
- Closing statement from the purchase of your home (which includes the address as well as buyers' and sellers' signatures).
- A notarized Student Residency Questionnaire from the owner of a residence within the District boundaries stating student and legal guardian are residing with said owner on a full-time basis, along with the homeowner's proof of residency.
- Prepaid hotel receipt.
- Signed contract to build along with a deposit of \$350 per student.
- Signed lease to begin renting within the 30 day grace period along with a deposit of \$350 per student.

Category B

1 or 2 of the following:

- Driver's license.
- Utility bill naming you the responsible person at the address.
- Homeowner/renter insurance for that address.
- Library card or Voter card.
- Automobile registration.

Important Notes

- All students entering Preschool, Kindergarten, Grades 5 and 9 must have a current physical and immunizations on file before Aug. 24.
- Bus schedules will be posted on our website and in *The Enterprise* newspaper after Aug. 15.
- Elementary schools will hold New Student Registration on Aug. 2 from 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. and Aug. 3 from noon - 8:00 p.m.. Charles Reed students can register at Grand Prairie. Liberty students can register at Lincoln. New students should register either during these special days or through the Registrars at the District Office before school begins.
