Dear Parents/Guardians of Senior Students:

This letter is for seniors in the class of 2021 regarding a state of Illinois graduation requirement to take the school-day SAT to receive a diploma from Plainfield CCSD 202. Traditionally, high school students fulfill this graduation requirement during their junior year by sitting for the SAT test in the spring. With the current pandemic of Covid-19, juniors were not allowed to sit for this exam last spring. In order for seniors with at least 15 credits at the start of the 2020 fall semester to fulfill this graduation requirement, the state of Illinois is paying for seniors to take the SAT in October or April.

Seniors with at least 15 credits will be given the choice to take the SAT in-person at their respective high school during October 2020 or wait until April 13, 2021. The high school will survey students and will assign students who choose October to one of two dates: October 14 or October 27. Only seniors who choose to take the SAT in October will receive a score in time to be used for admissions and scholarship opportunities for college. Offering three dates across October and April allows us to maximize social distancing and ensure that we can provide a safe environment for students and proctors. Students will be required to follow IDPH guidelines when entering, exiting, and during the exam, including wearing a mask. Please expect more detailed information along with your specific testing date from your high school in late September.

Students with accommodations that require extended time and a later dismissal time will also receive additional notification from their school.

Bus transportation will not be provided for students on these days.

If you have questions about the testing dates or procedures, please call your respective high school.
