trending down or flat

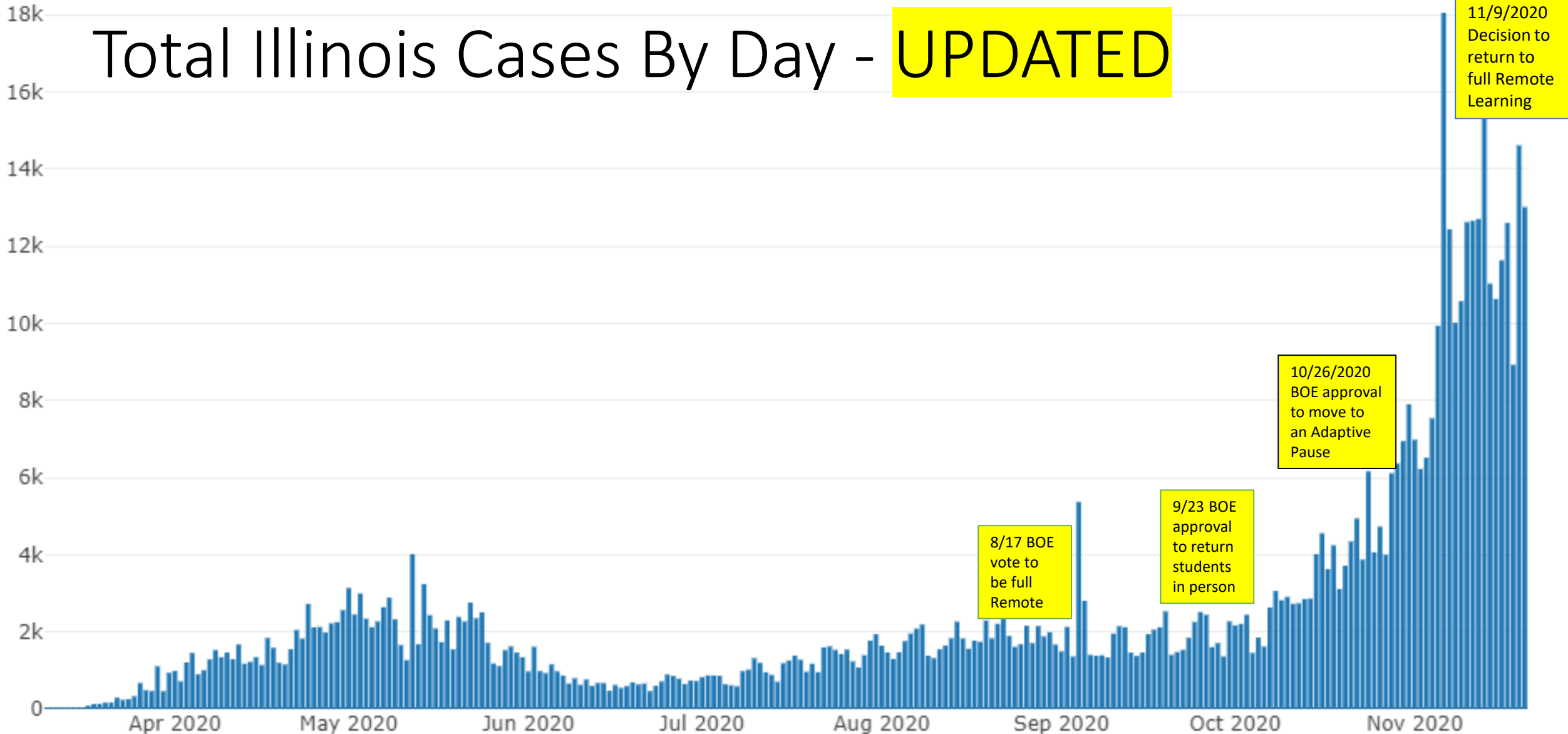
2. Cleaning and Disinfecting

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# Continue- Adaptive Pause

- Friday, November 20, 2020- All 11 regions of Illinois COVID Regions in **Tier 3 Mitigations**
- When there is substantial **Community Transmission**: IDPH recommends that districts should consider adaptive pause strategies such as
  - Extend remote learning
  - Cancel/Postpone after school events such as sports or extra-curriculars
  - Continue meal programs
- Tier 1 students started on 10/26/2020, **all students on adaptive pause** until further notice.
- Families will be asked to complete an **Educational Choice Form** after Thanksgiving Break to share intentions for 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter if it is safe to return to school.
  - Families will have the opportunity to choose between Hybrid or Remote Learning for each child.
  - Families that select the Remote Learning option will need to make that commitment for the third quarter (until March 19, 2021).
