

# STAFF FAQ

**District 202 has compiled a list of anticipated questions if the district offers in person school during the bus driver strike.**

## **What if parents can't get their child to school?**

Student absences will be excused. Teachers will have work available for students, either in Google Classroom, available in the office to get picked up, or provided to the student when they return to school in person.

## **Will students' absences be excused if parents cannot get them to school?**

Yes. All absences will be excused and students will have the opportunity to make up any missed work or tests.

## **Will teachers have to provide work if students are not able to attend school?**

Teachers will need to provide work for students, either in Google Classroom, send it to the office to get picked up, or provide it to the student when they return to school in person.

## **What should we do about students who are late to school due to transportation or long drop off lines?**

Teachers should not enter "late to school" until at least 30 minutes after the start of the day. Building administration may extend this time frame.

## **What if parents can get their children to school only by dropping them off early?**

Schools will be asking for volunteers to help supervise students before school. PASS and APT staff will be paid at their contractual supervision rate. Staff can be paid for supervision hours outside of their regular work hours.

Schools will have supervision available for early drop off for a limited time frame. If parents are not able to drop off their child at the regular drop off time, parents can drop off their child no earlier than the times listed below. The hours are

- High School: 6:30 AM
- Middle School: 7 AM
- Elementary School: 8 AM
- Preschool: 30 minutes prior to the start of each preschool session

## **Where should parents drop students off early? Where will the students wait until school starts?**

Building administrators will need to create a plan for where students can wait and what doors students should enter if they are arriving early. Administrators may want to send families a Google Form to determine how many students may come early or late so that they are prepared. The final plan will need to be communicated to families this evening.

**What if parents will be late picking students up?**

Schools will be asking for volunteers to help supervise students after school. PASS and APT staff will be paid at their contractual supervision rate. Staff can be paid for supervision hours outside of their regular work hours.

Schools will offer after school supervision for a limited time frame. Parents are expected to pick up their students no later than the times listed below if they are not able to pick up their child at the end of the regular school day. The hours are:

High School: 3:00PM

Middle School: 4:00PM

Elementary School: 4:30 PM

Preschool: 30 minutes after each preschool session

**If students are arriving early or staying late, do parents need to sign them in or out?**

We recommend that parents sign students in or out if they are arriving outside of the regular drop off or pick up times.

**Will there be athletic buses at the high school?**

There will not be transportation available for athletics unless the school is using the district mini-athletic buses.

**Can FBI community trips or field trips take place during the strike?**

No. Unfortunately, since regular education transportation is providing the transportation for both community trips and field trips, we will not be able to offer these trips during the strike.
